

Welcome to Epworth!



Today, we begin a series examining the last 24 hours of Jesus' life, based on a book by Adam Hamilton, 24 Hours That Changed the World. So much happened during Jesus' last day on earth—from sharing the Last Supper with his disciples to his betrayal and abandonment by these same disciples, to his challenging of

worldly power by refusing to retaliate, to extending mercy to those around him, and ultimately his death. Most years, the church covers these profound moments during Holy Week-the days between Palm Sunday and Easter. This year, we will go deeper, spending our entire Lenten season with Jesus during these last 24 hours. Today, we start with the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus had eaten the Last Supper with the disciples, they had sung the final hymn, and headed to a familiar place where Jesus had often prayed. There, Jesus took his closest three disciples—Peter, James, and John, further in the garden, asking them to stay alert. He needed space for his heart to break open and wrestle with the upcoming events, and he needed to know that his closest friends had his back. But, they did not. They kept falling asleep. Hamilton writes that the time was well past midnight. Perhaps they were tired. Perhaps they had drunk too much wine. Perhaps they had seen Jesus in trouble multiple times and always watched him find a way out. Clearly, though, this time Jesus truly needed them to stay awake and watch. He was anxious and troubled. Jesus must remain anxious and troubled when he looks at our world today. We hate and argue and mock and betray each other, which must break Jesus' heart. He invites us to stay awake and pray. His disciples could not. Can you?

Issues with Aging HVAC System

Have you noticed it has been a bit cold in many of the rooms and hallways of the church? We have had significant issues with our aging HVAC system. The units are 12 years old and between heavy use and the salt air, they are failing. Recently, at least 5 units have stopped working. The Trustees had Atlantic Refrigeration look at all our units and the results are that many of them are on their proverbial last leg. After many meetings with a group comprised of members of the Trustees, Finance and Governing Board, it was decided to replace most of the units. There will be 9 new rooftop units that heat and cool the large areas of the buildings. In addition, it was decided to replace some of the other rooftop units with the room units like we installed several years ago in the Education Wing. Keeping them all operating has been a costly endeavor. The new lease is an 84 month lease with a \$1 buyout at the end of the lease. The total costs of the units are just over \$250,000 or \$3,800 per month. This is a large expense but one we feel we can handle over the 7 year period. In addition, a full 10-year parts and labor warranty along with a 10 year maintenance agreement is included in the price. This allows us to have a fixed payment without any of the surprises.
